A lot of people are on overload and headed for a crash. Consider these statistics among U.S. citizens: People now sleep 2 1/2 fewer hours each night compared to people from one hundred years ago.

- The average office worker has 36 hours of work piled up on his or her desk. It takes three hours a week just to sort through it and find what we need.
- We spend eight months of our lives opening junk mail, two years of our lives playing phone tag with people who are too busy to answer, and five years waiting for people who are trying to do too much and are late for meetings.
- We're a piled-on, stretched-to-the limit society. Chronically rushed, chronically late, and chronically exhausted. Many of us feel like Job did when he said, "I have no peace! I have no quiet! I have no rest! And trouble keeps coming." (Job 3:26 GWT). Overload comes when we have too much activity in our lives, too much change, too many choices, too much work, too much debt, and too much media exposure.

Dr. Richard Swenson says, "The conditions of modern day living devour margin. If you're homeless we direct you to a shelter. If you're penniless we offer you food stamps. If you're breathless we connect you to oxygen. But if you're marginless we give you one more thing to do. Marginless is being thirty minutes late to the doctor's office because you were twenty minutes late getting out of the hairdresser because you were ten minutes late dropping the children off at school because the car ran out of gas two blocks from a gas station and you forgot your purse. That's marginless."

You need margin in your life. When you're not hurrying and worrying all the time, you have time to think. Time to relax. Time to enjoy life. Time to be still and know that God is God (Psalm 46:10).

#### **Detroit Mission Trip April 2015 Report**

Many people want to know about the mission trip that we recently took to Detroit. Specifically about the work we did and the state of the city. So, I will try to explain it to you, but really it needs to be experienced to get a clear picture. Nothing I say can give you the enormous, oppressive feeling of living in this 3<sup>rd</sup> worldesque city.

The first thing you need to understand is that the blight is endless. Wherever you go within the city of Detroit and many of the surrounding communities you experience neighborhood after neighborhood of destruction and desolation. There are thousands upon thousands of vacant homes. Many are stripped of all metal and some are half burned. Many of these structures are condemned and slated for demolition. The city has been demolishing houses in the recent months, so there are many vacant lots that dot the suburban communities. There are also many closed schools that have also been stripped of metal. It is reported that there are some 30 vacant high rise buildings in the city. Many stores and shops have long closed. The businesses that remain open are corner liquor stores, strips clubs, and a few other small businesses like hardware stores or beauty supplies. There are very few chain businesses in these areas. Not all of Detroit is like this, some of the suburbs of Detroit are very nice like Dearborn or Garden City.

There is a huge problem with violence. I read on one website that some of the communities that we worked in had a 1 in 7 chance of being a victim of a violent crime. The gang, drugs, and prostitution are rampant. Needless to say, Detroit is in a very bad state. While the urgency to help Detroit is

relativity new, the problems in Detroit span back to the seventies. This city has been in decline for decades. The problem has been exacerbated since the financial crisis of 2008.

So what can we do? How can we help? We can go and partner with church planters that are serious about reaching people for Christ and really making a difference. This trip we intentionally worked with City Church. This church has three campuses in different parts of the city. They do things a little different. They don't wait for the people to come to them, they go into the community. They feed people, they clothe people, they help with recovery, and they preach the gospel. God is blessing them in a mighty way!

We worked on their project called City Homes. They are rehabbing houses to be used for homeless recovery. People can live in these houses for three months to get back on their feet. They can stay longer if they want to continue in the program, which provides more help, but also more accountability. They have a real plan that will make a difference in Detroit. Our team from Oakhill helped finish one of the new men's houses. We did a lot of patching, mudding, sanding, and painting. We also did a few small projects at their women's house and at one of their church campuses. I really feel like we made a huge difference.

I would ask you to pray for City Church and City Homes. I also would encourage you to go with us to Detroit. We still have two trips left this year. We are taking college and young adults the week of August 9<sup>th</sup> and another adult team the week of October 4<sup>th</sup>. I hope to see you on one of these trips.

## Get the Big Picture of Missions

"Why I AM A Baptist" was the title of a great sermon I heard years ago. In addition to a clear presentation on Baptist beliefs, the minister articulated an additional reason I have come to appreciate more with every passing year. The way we cooperate to accomplish missions efforts around our nation and world is distinctive of what it means to be Southern Baptist. From how we appoint and support missionaries to the plan for shared giving through the Cooperative Program, what we do together through our churches extends our reach further than if we tried to do it alone.

When I served as a missionary in St. Vincent, I was mindful of the fact I lived in a house and drove a car provided by Southern Baptists through the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering. The money we received to buy food and educate our children were gifts from individuals in churches who understood the importance of shared missions. The most striking reminder of how blessed we were occurred when our Swedish missionary friends left the island for three months each year to return home and raise financial support for the next nine months of service. I knew then the way we cooperate was unique and a special gift. People I had never met cared enough about me to pray and give so I could serve fulltime without the added burden of returning home to be a fundraiser once a year.

I was born into a Baptist family and married a Baptist minister, but today I choose to be a Baptist not only because of Baptist beliefs but also because of the way we cooperate for missions.

From Alaska to New York to Houston, from Asia to Africa to South America, and in all the points between, I have the privilege of knowing I am a partner with our missionaries through my praying and giving. I feel blessed, and I hope you do as well.
